WEB DESIGN WITH WORDPRESS

WORDPRESS is an open source website creation tool built on PHP and MySQL. But it is probably the easiest and most powerful blogging and website content management system (CMS) in existence today. WordPress is available in 40 languages. 74.6 million (that's approximately 28% of the total) Web sites are powered by WordPress.

WordPress started in 2003 with a single bit of code and a handful of users. Since then it has grown to be the largest self-hosted blogging tool in the world.

BRENT KERLIN is the current Webmaster for DMA1.org. He has been working hard to migrate our HTML website to WordPress. Brent is SIG leader for the Dayton Diode SIG, and also a candidate for DMA Trustee.

ACRONIS HAS just announced Acronis True Image 2018. The new release includes major updates to the program's backup and recovery capabilities, and is the first personal backup software to incorporate artificial intelligence-based technology designed actively to protect data against ransomware. True Image 2018 has many new features including the following:

Backup activity and statistics

For every backup, you can easily view how many times it was started, if the operations were successful or not, size of the backed-up data, status of operations performed on the backup, and other details. This information is collected on the Activity tab, which allows you to track the full backup history starting from its creation.

Improved and simplified creation of WinPE-based media

This is much easier because Windows Recovery Environment is already included in Windows Vista and later versions of Windows, and you do not need to download additional components from the Internet. Similar to WinPE-based media, you can add your drivers for better compatibility with your hardware.

Acronis Active Protection dashboard

This is your new command center of anti-ransomware protection with all the necessary settings, statistics, summary, and exhaustive information on the current processes.

New Features of Acronis Active Protection 2.0

- ✓ *Detecting injections*, that is, attempts of ransomware to inject malicious code into healthy processes.
- ✓ *Using Machine Learning technology*: This technology allows us to analyze big data, update the process behavioral patterns on the basis of the analysis, and therefore temporarily improve quality of ransomware detection engine.

—Security Alert!—

THE DATABUS has received the following security alert from John Kennedy, our Regional Advisor from APCUG:

On Mon, September 18, 2017 at 3:45 P.M., John Kennedy (jkennedy [at] apcug.org) wrote:
Please share with everyone.

CCleaner version 5.33, published by the Piriform Company, was compromised with malware. Please check to see which version of CCleaner you have on your computer. Open CCleaner, and you will find the version number in the upper left



corner on the title bar. (See image above.) If you have the compromised version, update to the current one. (At press time, this was 5.35.)*

From Bleeping Computer:[†] “Version 5.33 of the CCleaner app offered for download between August 15 and September 12 was modified to include the Floxif malware, according to a report published by Cisco Talos a few minutes ago. Updating to recent versions removes malware.[‡]

Floxif is a malware downloader that gathers information about infected systems and sends it back to its C&C server. The malware also has the ability to download and run other binaries, but at the time of writing (9/18), there is no evidence that Floxif downloaded additional second-stage payloads on infected hosts.

The malware collects information such as computer name, a list of installed software, a list of running processes, MAC addresses for the first three network interfaces, and unique IDs partially to identify each computer. Researchers noted that the malware only runs on 32-bit systems. The malware also quits execution if the user is not using an administrator account.”

Avast recently bought Piriform. In an email to Bleeping Computer, Avast CTO Ondrej Vlcek said that

“The affected software (CCleaner v5.33.6162 and CCleaner Cloud v1.07.3191) has been installed on 2.27M machines from its inception up until now.” Vlcek added: “We believe that these users are safe now as our investigation indicates we were able to disarm the threat before it was able to do any harm.

“There is no indication or evidence that any additional ‘malware’ has been delivered through the backdoor,” Vlcek also added.

* EDITOR’S NOTE: At press time (24 September 2017), this was Version 5.35.

† EDITOR’S NOTE: Bleeping Computer is a secure Web site containing industry news, much of it security-related.

‡ EDITOR’S NOTE: The writer at Bleeping Computer was not very clear here. **Upgrading to a newer version of CCleaner does NOT remove the malware automatically.** You must update, and then scan your machine using a reputable anti-malware program like Malwarebytes.

FINAL EDITOR’S NOTE: At press time, it seems that there is more to the CCleaner problem than meets the eye. See: <https://arstechnica.com/information-technology/2017/09/ccleaner-malware-outbreak-is-much-worse-than-it-first-appeared/>

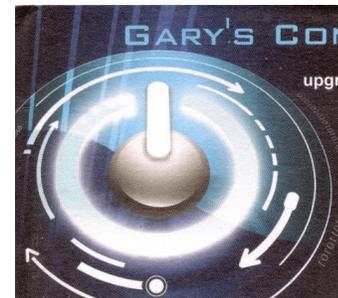
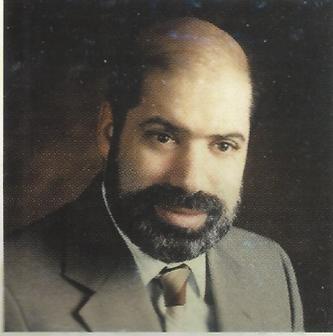
