IF YOU HAVE A COMPUTER CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET, there are thousands of radio stations to choose from. Here are some examples.

Classical Music Stations (Figure 1): https://www.internet-radio.com/stations/classical/

The scroll down list will change from time to time. Observe the "Genres" note for each listing. Just click on the play button to start the music. Once the music is playing, the play button becomes a pause button. You can keep the music playing while you open other program windows.

The free VLC Media Player program can also be used to listen to radio stations around the world.





This opens a long list of radio stations around the world. You are on your own to experiment to see if you can find something interesting. After you open a radio broadcast, you can minimize VLC and keep it running in the background while doing other things on your computer.

My friend also said he wanted an inexpensive way to back up his data. In addition, he wants to be able to carry his data with him. I suggested that he get a Sandisk thumb drive. I saw a 32 gig for \$7.99 and I wasn't even looking for a good deal. Of course, for under \$21.00 he could get 128 Gig Sandisk. My friend is cheap and I am sure he will opt for the 4 gig for \$1.89 (I *know* they are out there but don't ask me where they are available.)


A FRIEND JUST REMINDED ME that the holiday shopping season is here, and he wondered what he should be looking for. He is one of the most frugal people I know and at times still uses his old CP/M machine, so I thought I'd make a few suggestions.

My first suggestion is for him to dump his old computer and at least move up to DOS, preferably DR DOS or Microsoft's DOS 6.2. His reply was that he wanted to try Windows 10.

After picking myself off the floor, I had a few suggestions for my friend. If he is looking for value he should get a refurbished machine with at least a i5 processor. He should be able to find one for under \$200.00 including a manufacturer's warranty that is good for at least one year. The next thing he should do is get rid of that circa 1982 green screen and move up to a modern flat screen. I have seen a 19" Hewlett Packard on sale for \$29.00 (unbelievable—maybe it was a misprint?). I also noticed that there are Ben Q 24" monitors for \$99.00 and Dell 19" monitors available for \$49.00. There are deals available for curved screen monitors (I want a 27" Samsung curved screen monitor—I'll put it on the wish list that I am sending to Santa).

Next, my friend should replace the hard drive in his new machine with an solid state drive (SSD). I saw an 128 Gig Intel SSD available for \$29.00. It would make a great boot drive and could
