Windows 8 is the most significant upgrade to Windows since the introduction of Windows 95. Microsoft has completely revamped the GUI to accommodate a wide variety of devices. Users will feel at home with the new interface whether it is on a desktop, tablet or Windows Phone with its touchscreen interface or using a mouse and keyboard. This presentation will provide you with an overview of the GUI, explain some of the

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new terminology associated with the interface and give you a tour of what you can expect using the new OS. It will be available at special pricing of \$39.99 from October 26 through January 31, 2013 as a download, or you can reserve an upgrade copy at your local retailer for \$69.99.
