# DRONES & The UAS Training Center

Presented by JAY DAY, ANDREW SHEPHERD, MARK CAMDEN Door Prize: Zyma X5C Drone

Jay Day, owner of Dayton Drones, will show and demonstrate several types of quadcopters and hexacopters. Dayton Drones carries a full line of drones and accessories from micro quadcopters to large custom vehicles. Jay is an experienced drone pilot who provides flight training for individuals from groups of any skill level, using the training/obstacle course located inside the store or at outdoor locations.

DR. ANDREW SHEPHERD is Program Director for the National UAS Training and Certification Center at Sinclair Community College. He or one of his crew will give us a tour of this new program. Sinclair has been focused on emerging UAS technologies since 2008. Investments of over \$5M made the UAS Center possible. The program provides support for both students and researchers in an effort to meet the workforce needs of the growing UAS industry.

Sinclair actively operates UAS in the National Airspace System, with the most flights of any entity in Ohio since 2014, and is honored to be included as an active partner in both the Federal Aviation Administration ASSURE UAS Center of Excellence and National Science Foundation Center for Unmanned Aircraft Systems. Sinclair maintains active Educational Partnership Agreements focused on UAS with the Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) and Air Force Institute of Technology (AFIT). Sinclair has also founded and continues to sponsor *The Journal of Unmanned Aerial Systems*.



Leo graduated from Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD and went on to graduate from Purdue University with his M.S. and Ph.D. He

(Quinlivan) Tamburino, daughter Linda Athena and her husband Leslie Alan Dershem, granddaughter Victoria Lynne Dershem, and by his sister Antoinette (Tamburino) Konesky. Louis graduated from Carnegie Tech (Carnegie-Mellon) University with a B.S. degree and 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. commission and the University of Pittsburgh with a Ph.D. in Theoretical Physics. In graduate school his research led him to become the T in Taub-NUT Space. After graduation he did his Army active duty at



the Army's Electronic Proving Ground at Ft. Huachuca, AZ followed by reserve duty. A year of Post Doctoral work at the University of Syracuse followed. Following that he was a civilian scientist with the Air Force for 39 years with a distinguished research career in Gravitational Field Theory and General Relativity and made contributions to the fields of Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence. He held two patents for laser cameras. In 1991 Louis was made a Wright Laboratory Fellow of the AFRL He continued his research in the Target Recognition Branch until his retirement in 2002. He then consulted for the Air Force and with the Wright State University Computer Science Department as an Adjunct Research Associate Professor. He was a member of the IEEE, Sigma Xi, The Dayton Microcomputer Association, Miami Valley Consultants' Network, the Inventors' Council of Dayton, and was honored with a place on the Dayton Inventors' River Walk.
